About HOST: We are a nonprofit, 501 (c)(3) organization dedicated to help college students struggling with food and housing insecurity. We do things like build free food pantries on college campuses and provide scholarships for students who struggle to pay rent during the semester. Our vision is to have a HOST chapter, along with a free food pantry or food truck and low-cost housing, on every college campus in America. Our motto is: **"Students Helping Students."**

What we are looking for:

HOST is looking for part-time unpaid interns who are eager to learn about how to serve at a nonprofit organization that seeks to empower those in need. The ideal candidate would be a self-starter, resourceful, able to function independently and create their own schedule, while also bringing an optimistic, energetic attitude and a strong work ethic. Candidates majoring in marketing, business, or nonprofit management will be specially considered, but all majors are welcome to apply. The position is open to sophomores, juniors, seniors, and graduate students. A minimum 3.0 GPA is required.

What you will be doing: Promoting a nonprofit that helps college students that are food and housing insecure!

Our campus outreach intern will be visiting college campuses around San Diego, working to establish new host chapters within the club/student organization frameworks of every individual college. This will include presenting to other student organizations such as fraternities, sororities, and clubs, as well as alumni and staff organizations on college campuses, for the purpose of educating them on HOST's mission and activities. The intern will also recruit students on other college campuses who are willing to help start a chapter of HOST at their college as a student-run organization, in conjunction with the HOST nonprofit entity. The goal will be to ultimately establish free food and housing activities on each campus, for students who need such services.

Our Social Media specialist will oversee posts in the different social media platforms, specially those most used by college students.
